

LADY KIWANIANS POSSIBILITY NOW

Auxiliary Suggested at Session of Kiwanis

The Kiwanis club at its weekly luncheon Monday went across 100 per cent in the Red Cross membership drive, it was announced by the secretary, Joe R. Neff. A full attendance was present with several visitors, including Attorney Frank Pigman of the Gallon club. Three new members were received into the club and the resolution drawn up by the committee appointed from the Chamber of Commerce, the Rotary and Kiwanis clubs, relative to the vacation of Southern avenue through the property of the Ohio Crane Co., was read by A. A. Faffik of the Kiwanis representation, and heartily approved.

The formation of an organization auxiliary to the local Kiwanis club, by the wives of members who were guests at the entertainment given for Kiwanians and their families several weeks ago, was portended in a request transmitted by one of the club members Monday, for approval of a projected formation of such an organization, the approval being readily signified by the club as a whole and referred to the executive committee for further consideration.

A very interesting and instructive talk was given by Scott F. Hershey, of Napoleon, Ohio, who is to address the meeting of the Federated Bible classes of the city tonight at the Presbyterian church and who was the guest of the Kiwanians.
